Rising 7th grade Electives and Course Information

Core Courses:

Students are automatically placed in appropriate core courses (Standard, Advanced and Gifted) based on a review of previous grades, standardized testing and in some cases, teacher and guidance recommendations, in accordance with the district's pupil progression plan. Gifted and ESE services are also provided to students who are appropriately staffed in those programs. *Please see the verification form sent home for your child and return the signed form to your child's homeroom teacher. If you have questions about the core courses your child will be enrolled in, please contact our guidance department.*

Elective Courses: Your child will have (3) non-core courses. All course are year-long courses.

Elective options may change based on availability and student interest. Please see course descriptions below:

- X **Physical Education** (All 7th grade students are enrolled in Phys. Ed. unless they have a specific cause to be waived from the course. Waivers are available on the District website.)
- X **ICT 2** (All 7th grade students are enrolled in this course unless there is a specific circumstance that inhibits enrollment.)

It may not be possible to place students in their chosen electives due to constraints in the master schedule, adjusting for class size, course availability and/or enrollment in specialized courses (i.e., Intensive Math, Intensive Reading, and/or specialized instruction, if offered). We will most likely NOT be able to accommodate changes once the master schedule has been created. Once the school master schedule is finalized, changes in electives are addressed by need and availability. Every effort will be made to honor requests. *Please keep an open mind when choosing electives because adjustments may cause your child to be enrolled in a course other than the one he/she chose.*

Students receiving a level 1 or 2 on the FSA Reading and/or Math could be placed in an Intensive Reading, Intensive Math and/or a Learning Strategies course in lieu of a non-core course(s). These courses are year-long and may include multiple grade levels 6-8.

Title: Physical Education (Year) - This course is designed for 7th grade students. The purpose of this course is to develop the physical skills necessary to be competent in many forms of movement, knowledge of team sports concepts such as offensive and defensive strategies and tactics, and appropriate social behaviors within a team or group setting. The integration of fitness concepts throughout the content is critical to the success of this course.

Title: Band (Year) - Students with previous band experience expand on their instrumental technique, music literacy, and aesthetic response through rehearsal, performance, and study of a variety of intermediate-level, high-quality band literature. Instrumentalists extend their knowledge of music notation and theory, sound production, and personal and group rehearsal strategies. Public performances may serve as a culmination of specific instructional goals. Students may be required to attend and/or participate in rehearsals and performances outside the school day to support, extend, and assess learning in the classroom. Cost of instrument (e.g., borrow, rent, purchase) from an outside source and "fair play" fees, as well as fees associated with field trips, should be considered when choosing this elective.

Title: M/J Chorus 1 (Year) - Students with little or no choral experience develop beginning vocal technique and skills, critical and creative thinking skills, and an appreciation of music from around the world and through time. Public performances may serve as a culmination of specific instructional goals. Students may be required to attend and/or participate in rehearsals and performances outside the school day to support, extend, and assess learning in the classroom. Students who have had Chorus 1 will be enrolled in Chorus 2.

Title: Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Essentials (part of our STEM program) (Year) - STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. The purpose of this course is to provide students with the computer, digital, and information technology skills necessary for success in their future academic and occupational goals. In addition to

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fundamental computer information, the content includes but is not limited to digital technologies associated with web development, multimedia, word processing, spreadsheet, database, internet communications, cybersecurity, and computer programming. Instruction and learning activities are provided in a laboratory setting using hands-on experiences with the equipment, materials and technology appropriate to the course content and in accordance with current practices.

Title: Beginning Spanish (Year) - M/J Beginning Spanish introduces students to the target language and its culture. Students will learn beginning skills of listening and speaking and be introduced to basic skills in reading and writing in Spanish. Also, culture and comparisons are included in this one-year course.

Title: Exploring Two Dimensional Art (2D Art) (Year) - Students refine techniques used to create a variety of two-dimensional (2-D) artworks through developing skills in drawing, painting, printmaking, and collage. Students manipulate the structural elements of art to promote creative risk-taking in 2-D artwork. Investigation of artworks from Western and non-Western cultures provides a means for students to expand their understanding and appreciation of the role of art in global culture. Student artists use an art criticism process to evaluate, explain, and measure artistic growth in personal or group works. This course incorporates hands-on activities and consumption of art materials. A \$25.00 art donation is requested for this course.

**** Consistent with all course requests, if you would like your child to take an online course at Patriot Oaks Academy during the school day, the course MUST be requested now on the Course Verification Form or by contacting our guidance counselor, Ms. Watson, prior to the registration deadline. We will NOT drop or change any course (core course or elective) after the registration period ends (July 10th, 2017) without going through an administrative review. An online course taken during the school day does not have on-campus teacher support, only adult supervision. The virtual teacher is not on campus. **Please contact our middle school counselor, Ms. Watson, if you would like to pursue online courses (547-4060).****
