Dear Patriot Oaks families.

I apologize for the delay in getting our newsletter out this week! The days passed by quickly and before I knew it, it was Sunday evening. How does that happen?

We are excited to announce our 2nd Annual Parent Conference week. It will be held the week of October 1-5. This is a wonderful opportunity for you to meet with our teachers and discuss the progress of your children.

- Parents of elementary students have received or will be receiving an email for you to sign up for a conference sometime during that week. We strongly encourage all elementary families to meet with their child's teacher to discuss progress and how to support growth.
- Middle school parents: We will be trying a new format this year as scheduling with seven teachers would be difficult. The evening of Thursday, October 4, we will set up for 5 minute parent-teacher conferences in the gym and cafeteria from 3:30-7:00pm. All of our middle school teachers will be available there to meet with you on a first come- first served basis. You may have to wait in a line for a particular teacher so please come with a list of your child's teachers and prioritize who you would like to meet with. If you feel that 5 minutes is not enough time to discuss a big concern, no problem. You can reach out to the teacher via email to schedule a conference for another time. This is also the way to schedule any conference with a middle school teacher-just email them directly. In the past, the protocol was to go through guidance and we are changing that to try to cut down on the steps that it takes for parents to get a timely conference. Please go to the teacher directly and we will get that meeting scheduled quickly. We hope this helps.

Conferences between parents and teachers are so important! It is how we form a team to help your child reach his/her potential. We encourage all to participate. Conferences are more than just a review of grades. They are a time to share about your child- both from you and the teacher. Have questions and remember that we are only 2 months into the school year- we have a lot more time with your child. Be sure to ask, "What do I need to know? And "What can I do?"

We are excited to have the opportunity to meet with you. Remember, our mission is "committed to every student, every day!" We rely on you to help us meet that mission by being an active participant in your child's education. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to me.

Established in 1929, the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is one of the nation's premier organizations established to recognize outstanding middle level students. More than just an honor roll, NJHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, Character, and Citizenship. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since its beginning in 1929.

Today, it is estimated that more than one million students participate in activities of the NHS (High School) and NJHS (Middle School). NHS and NJHS chapters are found in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, many U.S. Territories, and Canada. Chapter membership not only recognizes students for their accomplishments, but challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service. Who is eligible for NJHS?

In order to apply, students must first qualify through their demonstration of success in the area of scholarship. That means, students in 7th or 8th grade must have a core GPA of 3.75 on a 4 point scale. Students will then fill out the application packet to give examples of their accomplishments in the remaining areas of Leadership, Service, Character, and Citizenship. Therefore, just because a student qualifies based on their GPA (scholarship), does not mean they will automatically be inducted into the NJHS.

What does an exemplary NJHS candidate look like?

Scholarship: Students who have a grade point average of 3.75 (on a 4.0 scale).

Service: This quality is defined through the voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without compensation and with a positive, courteous, and enthusiastic spirit.

Leadership: Student leaders are those who are resourceful, good problem solvers, promoters of school activities, idea-contributors, dependable, and persons who exemplify positive attitudes about life. Leadership experiences can be drawn from school or community activities while working with or for others.

Character: The student of good character upholds principles of morality and ethics, is cooperative, demonstrates high standards of honesty and reliability, shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others, and generally maintains a good and clean lifestyle.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

This year we will be teaching The Zones of Regulation program. This is a program designed to foster self-regulation and emotional support. It is a wonderful researched based program. K, 1, and 2 have received lessons on the zones and 3, 4, 5 will receive lessons in the next month. As the year goes on students will learn different strategies and build their toolboxes. WHAT ARE THE ZONES?

There are four zones to describe how your brain and body feel.

BLUE Zone – Your body is running slow, such as when you are tired, sick, sad or bored.

GREEN Zone – Like a green light, you are "good to go." You body may feel happy, calm and focused.

YELLOW Zone – This zone describes when you start to loose control, such as when you are frustrated, anxious, worried, silly or surprised. Use caution when you are in this zone.

RED Zone – This zone is for extreme emotions such as anger, terror and aggression. When you are in this zone, you are out of control, have trouble making good decisions and must STOP!

If you would like to your child to participate in this assessment, please send your \$15 check made out to Patriot Oaks Academy in an envelope labeled for Mrs. Watson/PSAT. In the memo line of your check, please add PSAT 8/9 and your child's name.

The deadline for enrollment is September 26th. Availability is on a first-come, first-served basis.

As of 1997, federal law mandates that students with disabilities who have an IEP (Individual Education Plan) must begin a process called transition planning at age 14. This program is designed to connect students with the proper transition planning services that give them the important skills and career planning tools to better prepare them for a successful life after high school, whether it be in a college setting or in the community.

GOAL: The Parent Advisory Committee is bringing together the school system and community-based organizations to support students that are beginning or already involved in transition planning.

TAKE AWAY: Students and families will know more about transition planning services available at schools and in our community.

ACTION STEPS: Make appointments with community groups that can help students reach their goals or support the family during the transition planning process.

Target Audience:

- Parents of students with disabilities
- Students with disabilities age 14 and up
- Teachers & administrators of students with disabilities

The purpose of the committee is to provide input to district staff regarding our ongoing effort to continuously improve services for students with disabilities.

HEALTH SCREENING

PATRIOT OAKS ACADEMY HEALTH SCREENING 2018

Dear Parents,

In compliance with Florida Statute 381.0056 (7), regarding school health services, we are notifying you that students in the St. Johns County School System will be offered free screening for vision, hearing, and height/weight measurement for growth and development. Screening will be held on September 25th and 26th, 2018.

If your child is tested and the results are not in the "normal" range for the particular test, you will be notified by letter. Your child will be screened unless you notify the school, in writing by signing below, no later than Friday September 21²² 2018, that you do not want your child to participate.

Nurses from the St. Johns County School District, in conjunction with school personnel and trained volunteers, will conduct the screenings. Screening is defined by Florida Statutes as "presumptive identification of unknown or unrecognized disease or defects by the application of a test that can be given with ease and rapidity to apparently healthy persons."
